We are happy to announce that applications are now open for the upcoming National Indigenous Business Summer School (NIBSS) Program, taking place from <u>January 12 - 17 2025.</u>

NIBSS is an exciting week-long program developed for Indigenous high school students entering Years 11 and 12 who are thinking about studying business, starting their own business, becoming an entrepreneur or are simply curious about university study. A full program of activities are organised across campuses at The University of Melbourne, Monash University, RMIT University, Swinburne University, Deakin University and La Trobe University.

All expenses of the program are covered (including travel/flights, accommodation, meals, activities, gala dinner, merch), and all students are supported throughout the week by Indigenous Mentors.

Who can apply?

To be eligible for the NIBSS 2025 Program, applicants must:

- Identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
- Be commencing Year 11 or 12 in 2025
- Be completing a Math subject/s at school
- Display a genuine interest in studying at university

How to apply?

The following forms need to be completed for the applicant to be considered:


- The applicant must complete the Student Application Form

Pathways to your dream degree

Applying for uni next year but worried that you won't meet the ATAR requirements for your dream degree? Most institutions offer pathway options for applicants who don't meet the standard entry criteria for their courses. Often, you'll be able to find a different avenue into the course you're aiming for.

If you don't get an offer into your chosen degree because you haven't met the required lowest selection rank, you could start an alternative undergraduate course with a lower entry rank. Once you've successfully completed the first year of that degree, and have results that will improve your selection rank, you can then apply again for the degree you really want. AFTRS First Nations Scholarships are awarded on the basis of creative excellence or equity. The scholarships are intended to assist Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander, with the costs associated with higher education at AFTRS.

The amount of annual support vary, between:

- Up to \$7,500 for the Bachelor of Arts Screen: Production;
- Up to \$12,500, for the Graduate Diploma in Radio & Podcasting (full time);
- Up to \$6,500 for the Graduate Diploma in Radio & Podcasting (part time), per year;
- Up to \$25,000 for Master of Arts Screen; and
- Up to \$12,500 for Master of Arts Screen: Business, depending on a student's individual circumstances.

- The Dylan Alcott Foundation (DAF) Scholarship aims to break down barriers to education and empower aspiring filmmakers with a disability to achieve their creative dreams. Valued at \$50,544 in 2025, this scholarship will remove a significant financial hurdle and allow a talented student to focus on their studies and hone their filmmaking skills.
