

Undergraduate applications are open

Applications for undergraduate study are open. Institutions are still finalising details for some semester 1, 2025 courses and these will become available for selection in the application when confirmed. All courses should be available from early August.

Once you've submitted your application, you can log back in and change your selected courses as many times as you like at no extra cost.

As to when offers will be made, that depends on the institution, the course, and the qualification on which you're being assessed: when to expect your offer.

As a domestic applicant, when you submit an undergraduate application you also unlock access to the following schemes and scholarships:

Educational Access Scheme: an opportunity to ask institutions to consider circumstances that affected your Year 11 and 12 (or equivalent) studies.

Equity Scholarships:

awarded to applicants who are most in need of financial support while studying. Current university students can also apply.

<u>Schools Recommendation Scheme:</u> a way for 2024 Year 12 applicants to be assessed on criteria other than (or in addition to) the ATAR and receive an early offer.

Do you have your USI?

All students at Australian universities need a government-issued unique student identifier (USI). Without one, you won't be able to receive your qualification/award or, if you're eligible, access HECS-HELP. At the request of institutions, all domestic applicants who are Australian citizens must now enter their USI in their UAC application. Create your USI or check if you already have one

Medicine and law applicants: plan ahead

Entry into some highly competitive undergraduate degrees such as medicine, dentistry and law may require applicants to sit an admissions test.

Medicine and dentistry

Many universities require you to sit the <u>University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT)</u> in July. Registrations are open now.

If you're applying for postgraduate medicine degrees, most universities require you to sit the <u>Graduate Medical School Admissions Test (GAMSAT)</u>. Registrations open in May for the next test in September.

Law

If you're a domestic student interested in studying law at UNSW in 2025, you will need to sit the <u>Law Admission Test (LAT)</u> in September. It assesses your critical thinking, analytical and problem-solving skills and your ability to organise and express ideas. Registrations open 13 May.



Early Entry Program Applications Now Open

Applications for our Early Entry Program are open for Semester 1, 2025. Our free Early Entry Program means students can receive an offer to study at the University of Newcastle before commencing HSC exams.

Offers are conditional on students completing the HSC or equivalent. Applicants must be undertaking a study pattern indicative of eligibility for an ATAR in Year 12.

Key Dates

- 8 April Early Entry Program applications open
- 5 September Round 1 early offers released
- 19 September Round 2 early offers released
- 4 October Round 3 early offers released

Eligible applicants will receive only one early offer. Students should consider this when completing their preferences. After receiving an early offer, recipients cannot change their preferences to receive multiple offers in later rounds.

Students can apply for free now.
