Psychology is a field where professionalism is of utmost importance. Psychologists need to participate in ethical conduct, which includes all forms of communication with clients. Skills that are essential in the practice of psychology include strong listening and communication skills, personal integrity, empathy and self-awareness. During the course of practice, a psychologist is expected to encounter clients who have a range of comorbidities and may require an interdisciplinary approach.
