YEAR 10 SELECTING SENIOR SUBJECTS

It would be good for Year 10 students to begin thinking about what subjects they may want to study in Year 11 and 12. Next term, students will be asked for their subject preferences for Year 11 study. More information will be available about the process in due course. A software program called Edval Choice is used to collect student subject preferences.

One of the software resources that can be helpful in providing information about choosing senior subjects is Job Jump. Students (and parents) can have a Job Jump account which is provided by the College. (Note that the password to create a Job Jump account is "finches"). The Job Jump program can suggest senior courses to study that align with students' career and/or University interests.

Most of the information below is from Job Jump and is helpful to for suggestions about subjects that relate to various career and University interests.

Subject Advice for Your Future Career

- 1. Log In to JobJump (https://jobjump.com.au/).
- 2. Using the Menu, select Subjects.
- 3. Find your preferred career or career area, a box will appear with good subject advice and questions to consider, including HSC subjects, which you will find in bold. You can also save your subject preferences for later.




Subject Advice for Your Future Uni Course

Are you thinking of going to University? Do you want to check the HSC subjects suggested for your future Uni courses?

Watch this video (https://jobjump.com.au/helpVideo?video=myAtar) or follow the steps below.

- 1. Log In to JobJump (https://jobjump.com.au/).
- 2. Open the menu and select Search under the ATAR heading.
- 3. Enter the ATAR you're hoping to achieve or select I'm not sure.
- 4. Select the category of degrees you are interested in.
- 5. Press the Show Senior Subjects option (in the red box below).
- 6. Underneath each course listing there is the HSC Subject information you need.



Subject Selection Requirements

There are a number of subject selection requirements... the main two are...

- You need to select at least 12 units when going into Year 11. Generally, each subject (e.g. Biology, Business Studies, Drama, ...) is worth 2 units although some courses are 1 unit courses (e.g. Extension Maths, Extension English, Photography,...)
- English is compulsory. Most English courses are worth 2 units of study.

With the remaining 10 units, consider what your school offers. You may need to also think about having back up subjects just in case your school does not run all the subjects you want to study. This sometimes happens because of too few students to form a class or clashes (two subjects you want to do running at the same time on the timetable).

You may also want to think about wanting to receive an ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank). An ATAR is a rank worked out by the Universities Admission Centre (UAC) and is used as part of the process in applying for University study after Year 12.

It is helpful to discuss your subject selection with your parents, the teachers who teach the subjects you like and senior students who study the HSC subjects you like. You could also look at the course description for the subjects you like in your school's Senior Subject Selection Handbook.

ATAR eligibility and calculation

To be eligible for an ATAR in NSW, you must satisfactorily complete at least 10 units of HSC courses.

These courses must include at least:

- 10 units of Board Developed courses
- 2 units of English
- three Board Developed courses of 2 units or greater
- four subject areas.

Your ATAR is then calculated from your:

- best 2 units of English
- best 8 units from your remaining units.

What subjects do or don't count towards an ATAR?

There are two main types of HSC courses: Board Developed Courses and Board Endorsed Courses.

Board Developed Courses.... your achievement in these can count towards your <u>Australian Tertiary</u> <u>Admission Rank (ATAR)</u>. Most courses offered at GPCC are Board Developed courses.

Board Endorsed Courses are generally developed by schools, TAFEs or universities. They contribute to the HSC, but don't count towards your ATAR. E.g. Photography, Sport, Lifestyle and Recreational Studies

When selecting your subjects, pick subjects that meet these objectives:

- Your interests and your future career.
- Courses in which you have an aptitude.
- Courses to give you a good understanding and foundation to succeed in tertiary studies.
- Don't select courses because of scaling or perceived ATAR as you could be disappointed.

Subject Requirements for University Courses

Prerequisites. These are HSC courses you must have studied before a Uni will offer you a place in their course.

Assumed knowledge. These are HSC courses the Uni assumes you have studied before you start the Uni course. Not a requirement for entry, but without the assumed knowledge you may have difficulties coping with your Uni studies.

Recommended studies. These are HSC courses the Uni suggests will prepare you for core first year Uni courses. Not a requirement for entry.

What if I haven't chosen the assumed or recommended HSC subjects for the university course I wish to study?

You can still get an offer if you haven't studied assumed or recommended courses. It is important, however, to check for any pre-requisite HSC subjects as pre-requisite courses are necessary to gain an offer for certain University courses.

In the case of Assumed Knowledge HSC subjects, you may need to catch up on background knowledge through:

- bridging courses. (These are offered at most Universities. If this applies to you, ask the Uni when you go to their Open Days or simply call them).
- extra subjects within the Uni course structure.



The degrees available under the admissions scheme are:

If you are a HSC student in NSW, you must do the following:

- Apply to UAC by the relevant September Round 1 deadline.
- List your chosen music degree as your first preference.
- Meet the audition/portfolio and interview requirements in the July or September rounds of auditions.

You are encouraged to apply in the July round of auditions (UAC August Round 1) where you will be able to audition live and have a chance to secure an early offer before submitting HSC work or undertaking exams.

For most NSW Year 12 HSC students, no separate application is required, and your Year 11 and 12 results and predicted ATAR will be obtained automatically through UAC by the Sydney Conservatorium of Music.
