UAC ZOOM MEETING FOR YEAR 12

On Tuesday 21 May, Year 12 had an extended Year Meeting to hear from Universities Admission Centre (UAC) about tertiary study and application requirements to receive an offer for University courses next year.

Information about the ATAR, application process, Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS) and Educational Access Scheme (EAS), preferences and University offers was provided and also the opportunity to ask questions. For a teaching course at one of the following institutions, the applicant must answer a question about their motivation and suitability for teaching as part of their UAC application:

- Australian Catholic University
- Australian College of Physical Education
- Charles Darwin University
- Charles Sturt University
- Griffith University
- Macquarie University
- Southern Cross University
- University of Canberra
- University of New England
- University of Notre Dame
- University of Sydney
- University of Technology Sydney
- University of Wollongong

Other institutions may have alternative questionnaires or statements to complete.

Applicants will be prompted to answer the question after they submit their initial UAC application. Their response will be valid for all teaching preferences to the above institutions.

Tips for writing responses

Applicants will be asked to write a minimum of 100 words in response to the following question: 'What has inspired you to become a teacher and why do you think teaching is a good career choice for you?'

When writing a response, consider including:

- who and what has inspired you to become a teacher
- the types of skills and abilities you will bring to teaching
- any leadership or community activities you have engaged in.

Before submitting the response, be sure to check for spelling and grammatical errors.



Early offer run-down

UAC applications are off to a strong start, with thousands of Year 12 students having already applied. So it's a good time to set some clear expectations about when they might receive an offer.

The ATAR is still the main selection tool used by the majority of unis. Therefore, most offers to Year 12 students will be made from December Round 2 (23 December) onwards, after the release of ATARs on 18 December.

However, there are other ways for students to show that they're ready to succeed at tertiary study. This means they may be able to receive an offer to university before ATARs are released.

Offers made through UAC

The first offers to Year 12 students will be made to <u>Schools Recommendation Scheme</u> (SRS) applicants on **8 November 2024**. Offers made then will be based on criteria like Year 11 results and the school's rating of the student. They can be unconditional or conditional offers.

Unconditional offers don't require the student to meet any other criteria (apart from completing Year 12). Conditional offers have additional requirements – usually a minimum ATAR or selection rank.

Before November, offers are made to applicants who are not in Year 12 this year and already have a qualification we can assess. They're often applying to start a course in semester 2.

Offers directly from the institutions

In addition to submitting an SRS application, Year 12 students can apply directly to individual institutions for an early offer. Each institution has different application and offer dates, although no offers will be made before September. All the details are on our website.

When applying for the Early Offer Scheme, your achieved results from the relevant Year 11 subjects will be assessed by UC.

UCAT Practice Tests and Question Banks

These example questions and practice tests are produced by the UCAT Consortium and are representative of the live test. We recommend you use these official materials to prepare for your test. Don't forget to read the information about the Test Tools before you start, as it explains how to use the on-screen calculator and keyboard shortcuts. Although introduced to Australia and New Zealand in 2019, the UCAT has been used for over 12 years in the UK under the historic test name UKCAT. These UCAT preparation materials represent the content of the UCAT ANZ test and should be used to familiarise yourself with the test format and to prepare for the test. As practice materials are compiled from previous test questions, there may be a higher proportion of questions with a UK context than you will see in the UCAT ANZ.

UCAT ANZ Test Format

The UCAT is a two-hour computer-based test which assesses a range of abilities identified by universities as important to practicing in the fields of medicine / dentistry / clinical sciences. The test consists of five separately timed subtests which each contain a number of questions in a multiple-choice format. Once the test has started it cannot be paused but each subtest is preceded by a 1 minute instruction section. Candidates can apply for Access Arrangements to sit an extended version of the test if they have a documented medical condition or disability.
