
UAC Presentation to Year 12



UAC

Everything you need to know about the ATAR in (just over) 2 minutes

HSC students: don't stress!

Here's a quick and simple ATAR explainer without all the jargon.

The ATAR is a rank, not a mark.

The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) is a number between 0.00 and 99.95 that indicates a student's position relative to all the students in their age group (ie all 16 to 20 year olds in NSW). So, an ATAR of 80.00 means that you are 20 per cent from the top of your age group (not your Year 12 group).

Universities use the ATAR to help them select students for their courses and admission to most tertiary courses is based on your selection rank (your ATAR + any applicable adjustments). Most universities also use other criteria when selecting students (e.g. a personal statement, a questionnaire, a portfolio of work, an audition, an interview or a test).

The average ATAR is usually around 70.00.

Steps to Uni for International Students

You are an international student if you are not an Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen or permanent resident of Australia.

Australian tertiary institutions offer a broad range of study options and areas of specialisation, from arts and humanities, business and economics to communications and media studies, creative arts, education, engineering, health and medical sciences, science and technology, and teaching. Qualifications gained in Australia are recognised around the world.

If you apply to study in Australia through UAC, you'll be applying to institutions located in New South Wales (NSW) and the Australian Capital Territory (ACT) or close to these states' borders.

To successfully become an AFP officer, you must be trustworthy, respectful, accountable, fair and committed to using intelligent action to outsmart serious crime.

To ensure we are able to stay a step ahead, we're looking for people who are committed to our principles of prevention, deterrence, collaboration and innovation.

To be a police officer or protective service officer in the AFP, you must:

- Be 18 years of age or over
- Be an Australian citizen
- Hold a valid full, provisional or automatic-only driver's licence
- Have at least a Year 10 certificate with a Cert IV/Diploma level qualification or Trade Certificate. University-level qualifications are welcomed
- Complete and submit the AFP Employment Suitability Questionnaire

- Provide your traffic history
- Undergo security vetting
- Undergo drug and alcohol testing
- Meet character standards if you have a history of breaking the law (even as a juvenile) or associating with people who are well-known to law enforcement, you may not be able to work for the AFP.
