From year three, most of your training is spent in clinical placements that cover the broad range of general, specialist and inter-professional training necessary to prepare you for your medical internship. You'll also undertake a research project during your clinical years.

You'll return each year to the same rural and regional community – allowing you to build relationships and connections and experience the attraction of permanently locating to these areas.


