

Traffic Management Plan For Our Children's Safety

This Traffic Management Plan has been developed with the paramount aim of ensuring the safety of children when they arrive or leave the College. Compliance with this Plan will also improve traffic flow in peak periods.

- 1. Revised Traffic entrances/exits and Procedures are now in place for the new Gate 3 Entry/Exit way and Gate 4 exit.
- **2.** TRAFFIC WARDENS are on duty during peak periods to supervise the movement of students and vehicles. Please follow their instructions.
- **3.** PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS, monitored by Traffic Wardens, should be used in order to promote the safe separation of pedestrians and vehicles.
- **4.** Any PRE-SCHOOL AGE CHILDREN are to be supervised at all times, including holding hands whenever possible.
- 5. Kiss and Drop zones are supervised
 - Display your surname in your windscreen
 - if your children are not ready for collection you will need to park and collect for Zone 3 or flow back around for P1.
 - Students should only enter vehicles from the kerbside
- 6. As is the case on public roads, MOBILE PHONES should not be used whilst driving in the car park area.
- 7. Please take care when OPENING CAR DOORS as that can injure pedestrians and/or cause damage to vehicles.
- 8. Do not park in adjacent business, including 7-Eleven and TankWorks.
- 9. Unless you hold a permit, Gate 2 and P2 is for the use of Little Coasties parents and those on Church Business only.
- 10. Students are to park in student designated carparks in P3 or P4 (as advised).
- 11. Students travelling on BUSES must use the covered walkway when walking to or from buses and must not use the car park.

Traffic and Parking around the School

Parking rules are designed to stop vehicles from parking where it would be dangerous or inconvenient for others. Please consider the residents when parking in streets surrounding your school.

A School Zone is the area around a school with a speed limit of 40 km/h.
Between the School Zone and End School Zone signs you must obey the
school zone speed limit. The school zone speed limit only applies on
gazetted school days and during the times shown on the sign.



• School Bus lights – buses use signs and orange flashing 'wigwag' lights to warn motorists and pedestrians that they are picking up or setting down school children. The lights begin to flash when the bus stops and the doors are opened. They keep flashing for about 30 seconds after the doors close and continue even after the bus moves off. You must not drive past the bus in the same direction at more than 40 km/h while the 'wigwag' lights are flashing as there may be children crossing or about to cross the road.



• A **No Parking Zone** means that you must not stop for more than two minutes. You must remain in or within three metres of the vehicle. No Parking Zones are suitable for dropping off and picking up.










THESE SIGNS MEAN YOU MAY STOP HERE TO DROP OFF / PICK UP

- stop for up to 2 minutes only
- stay within 3 metres of vehicle

A Bus Zone means that the area is restricted for bus use only. If hours of
operation are shown, the restriction only applies to this time. You may use this
area outside of these times.
