Textiles Technology is a practical subject that aims to develop confidence and skills in the design, production and evaluation of textile items.

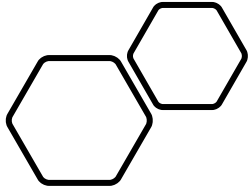
It involves traditional and innovative ways to sew and decorate materials.



Textiles Technology

- Students investigate the work of textile designers and make judgements about the appropriateness of design ideas, the selection of materials and tools, and the quality of textile items.





CREATIVE

- Textile projects give students the opportunity to be creative, independent learners and to explore functional and aesthetic aspects of textiles.



COURSE OUTLINE

Practical project work is the focus of Textiles Technology and occupies the majority of course time.

It is based on the following focus areas and could include making:

- Apparel – clothing and accessories such as shoes, hats, scarves
- Furnishings – cushions, quilt covers, beanbags
- Costume – theatre costumes, masks, traditional costumes, fancy dress costumes and dance costumes
- Textile Arts – fabric-based artworks, embroidery, wearable design
- Non-apparel – toys, bags, surfboard covers.

- Textiles Technology is suitable for both male and female students.
