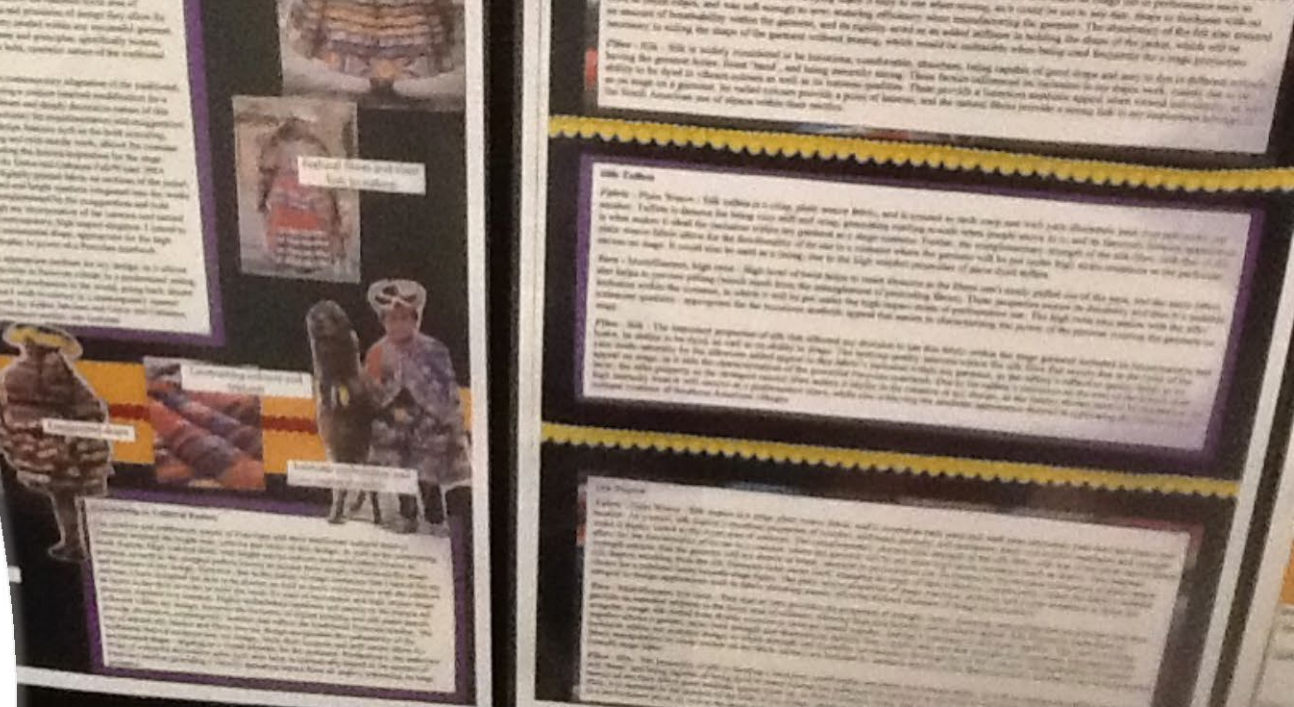
HSC Course

Design Ideas

In the HSC course, the Major Textile Project allows students to develop a textile project that reflects either a cultural, historical or contemporary aspect of design.



Students attend excursions where they learn to complete production drawings for their Year 12 folio work.

They see the TexStyle Exhibition each year in Sydney to gain insights into the works of other talented students completing the HSC.
